Next Club Meeting on Tuesday 22nd December

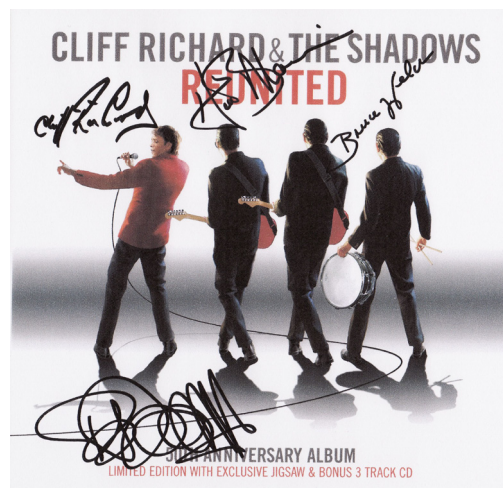

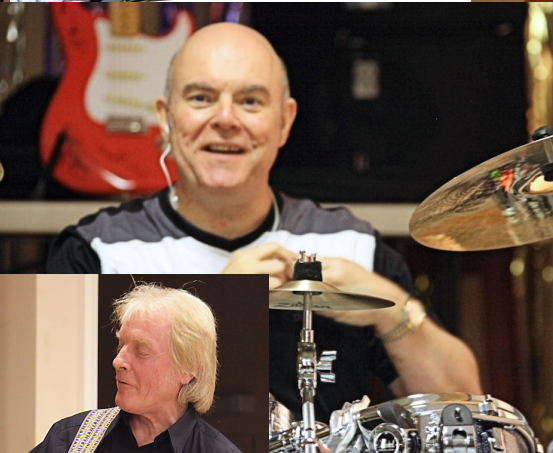
Can't wait to play for you all again - see you there on Tuesday 22nd December!
