Next Club Meeting on Tuesday 26th January


The snow got us! All the preparation in the world for a grand ol' Christmas bash and we had to cancel it due to the awful weather and treacherous conditions.

Those of us running the club would certainly not like to see our club following those other clubs into backing track territory. My suggestion would be that the only time a backing track is used is when the band doesn't know the number you want to play.

With that in mind, it would be great to see more drummers pitching up to play at our meetings. We already have at least three bass and rhythm guitarists who come up and have a go and this is a great way to add variety and give the existing band members a chance to socialise during the course of the evening.

If you're reading this and you're a drummer, please practice up some Shadows and Cliff material and pop



along to the meetings. Our rule at Berkshire is that anyone who wants to play in the back line can do so, as long as they are proficient on the instrument they play, so please ensure you are able to compliment the existing back line if you come up to play. The back line is there to back the guitarists, and they are expecting us to be able to play the numbers they're doing.

Venue thoughts

Although our venue has a great hall and lots of parking, it has been suggested by a couple of members that we look for an even better venue in 2010. My preference would be to find a social club somewhere, where there is a live bar during the evening and more "atmosphere". We would sincerely welcome your thoughts on this.
